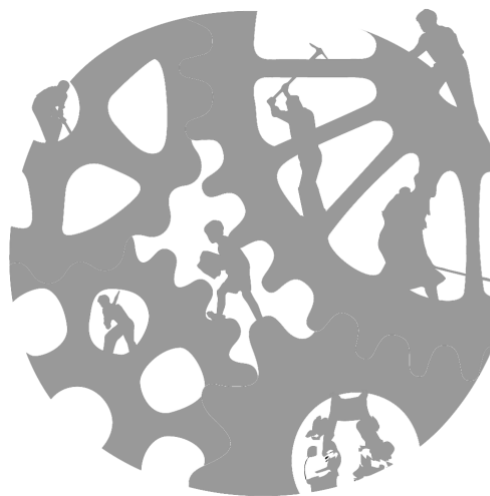


6.1: Introducing week six

So welcome to week six of our course on forced and precarious labour. In previous weeks we focused first on global supply chains and then on the politics and practice of migrant labour. This week we shift to our third thematic case study, sex work. Sex work is the most controversial of the three issues that we're going to be considering in this course, and this controversy ultimately rises from competing positions regarding how and on what terms sex for money takes place.

In the next video my colleague Prabha Kotiswaran from Kings College London will first introduce you to some of the competing approaches regarding sex work, and then outline what some of the arguments look like for considering sex work as work like any other.
